

- While avoiding significant economic impact


Marine Reserves:

- · Ocean development is prohibited


Marine Protected Areas:


• Ocean development prohibited, but some fishing allowed (varies by site)



















ODFW Human Dimensions Research

Findings

- General public knows little about marine reserves
 - Coastal residents more aware than I-5 corridor residents
 - Both coastal and I-5 residents feel somewhat positive about existence and impacts of marine reserves

- Marine reserve economic impact is low
 - Interviews with Garibaldi fishers support finding that economic impact is low
