### 2025 4<sup>th</sup> of July Update

#### 10<sup>th</sup> St. Access

- Will remain open this year
- Considered pedestrian safety corridor
  - 10<sup>th</sup> St. is too skinny to maintain two lanes of travel and designated walking path
- Signage
  - Will be placing numerous signs along the shoulder of 10<sup>th</sup>
  - Signs consist of:
    - No Parking Along Sholder
    - 4 Wheel Drive Vehicles Only
    - Warning Soft Sand
    - Tow Zone
    - Caution Pedestrians
  - Officers will attempt to monitor access

#### Officer Directives

- Emphasis will be put on posting an officer at the shore off of 10<sup>th</sup>
  - Officers will be monitoring activity
    - Large crowds of disorderly conduct
    - Minors in Possession (MIP) of alcohol and controlled substances
    - Dangerous illegal firework activity
    - Fighting and/or lewd conduct
    - Mandatory parental contact for MIP under 18 years of age
      - Cases forward to Juvenile Department
    - Citations for all violations
    - Arrests when applicable

#### Marion

- During the day and into the evening and early morning hours
  - Monitor parking along Marion
  - Field interview occupants of vehicles into the morning
    - More MIP conduct
- Provide a safety space between intersections
  - No Parking signage in intersections of Marion
    - Approximately 10-15 feet on both sides
    - Opens the view for exiting vehicles
    - Lowers risk for collisions



#### Fireworks

- Dangerous activity on beach will be investigated
- Primary focus will be on surface streets within city limits
  - If observed by an officer, enforcement, including a warning or citation will be issued

#### Outside Agency Collaboration

- Chief to meet with other law enforcement executives to finalize discussions regarding their tactical plans
  - June 19<sup>th</sup>, 2025
- Conversation has been going on for a couple months already
  - All agencies are staffing accordingly
  - SPD will have 16 (estimate) OSP – MRT Bicycle Troopers in town
  - CBPD will be available for emergencies
  - WPD & APD will be focused on North County enforcement
  - CCSO should have a Deputy assigned to the coastline
    - Will respond if needed but limited and potential long wait times
  - OSP will be staffed, however, primary focus will be the highways and mass influx of people to our area
    - Will respond if needed but limited and potential long wait times

#### Expectations

- Officers will be working
  - Traffic enforcement – Including crashes
  - Call response
  - Parking violations
  - Illegal fireworks
  - Disorderly Conduct
  - Noise complaints
  - DUII's
- Expect a very long weekend
  - Excessively large amount of people
  - Activities potentially beginning Thursday evening
  - Lasting into Sunday evening
    - Lots of traffic congestion into early morning hours on 4<sup>th</sup> of July
