HISTORY OF GEARHART

The area now known as Gearhart was purchased by Phillip Gearhart in 1851. He bought a squatters right for one thousand dollars, using it to create a 640 acre donation land claim. By 1863 he had increased his holdings to 1108 acres. This entire parcel encompassed all of what is now Gearhart. The city was incorporated on January 28, 1918. The first zoning ordinance was passed by the Gearhart City Council in 1960. Citizens wanted zoning that would keep the majority of Gearhart residential. In 1973, the City Council established the Gearhart Planning Commission and it's first responsibility was to complete a Comprehensive Plan for the city. The city retains its character and residential nature through this Comprehensive Plan. In 2017 the population of Gearhart was 1,593. In 2018 Gearhart celebrated its Centennial year.
