#### **Ordinance 942 Definitions:**

- 1. Tree: For the purpose of this section, "tree" is defined as any tree with a primary trunk greater than thirty-eight (38) inches in circumference, as measured four and one-half (4½) feet above the existing grade.
- 2. Fifty-Five Inch Tree: Any tree with a primary trunk greater than fifty-five (55) inches in circumference, as measured four and one-half (4½) feet above the existing grade.
- Heritage Tree: A tree designated as significant due to its age, size, species, or historical association, as determined by the Gearhart Planning Commission.
- Heritage Tree and Fifty-Five Inch Tree Root Zone: The area extending from the base of the tree to the outermost edge of the tree's canopy, encompassing the critical root zone.

#### Permit Type Requested:

## Minor Tree Cutting Permit:

Required for the removal of three (3) trees or less, per 12 months, none of which qualify as a Heritage Tree or Fifty-Five Inch Tree.

Required for removal of a Heritage Tree or a 55" inch Tree in certain situations exempt from a major tree removal permit.

## Major Tree Cutting Permit:

Required for the removal of four (4) or more trees, or removal or impact to the root zone of any Heritage Tree or Fifty-Five Inch Tree, unless exempt.

## Criteria for Approval:

- 1. Submission of Application: Fully completed form with all supporting documentation.
- Site Map: Detailed map showing tree locations, environmental zones, and proposed modifications.
- 3. Circumference Measurements: Provide circumference measurements for all trees.
- 4. Heritage Designation Confirmation: Verification if trees are designated as Heritage Trees.

## Criteria for Approval: (Major)

Applications will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- 1. Safety: Trees posing an imminent hazard to public or property safety.
- 2. Disease: Removal of diseased trees, substantiated by an arborist or forester's professional report.
- Development Necessity: Trees obstructing approved structures, utilities, grade changes, or authorized site modifications.
- 4. Environmental Impact: Ensuring tree removal does not adversely affect designated wetlands or riparian areas.
- Heritage and Fifty-Five Inch Trees: Additional scrutiny for trees within these classifications, requiring justification.
- 6. Mitigation Efforts: Demonstration of adequate steps to replace or offset tree loss.

Per Ordinance 942, any person proposing to remove trees meeting the definitions above must secure approval from the City of Gearhart **prior to removal**. Specific requirements include:

- 5. Submission of Application: Fully completed form with all supporting documentation.
- Site Map: Detailed map showing tree locations, environmental zones, and proposed modifications.
- Certified Report: Tree care specialist for trees marked as diseased.
- 8. Circumference Measurements: Provide circumference measurements for all trees.
- 9. Heritage Designation Confirmation: Verification if trees are designated as Heritage Trees.
- 10. Mitigation Plan: Outline of replanting or other mitigation efforts.


